Gilded chandelier in the style of André-Charles Boulle

Earlier this year we acquired a large brass chandelier that required restoration (image below). We had the chandelier gilded and wired for electricity.

We knew very little about the chandeliers history other than it was likely to have come from Cranbrook School in Kent. However after researching the metalwork elements we found that the chandelier combines a number of documented examples and designs executed by André-Charles Boulle (1642 – 1732). With the central stem flanked by female caryatids, the lower tier headed by Bacchic masks and acanthus wrapped, panelled, S-scroll arms with circular drip pans and urn shaped nozzles.

The chandelier is currently on display and available to purchase at John Bly Antiques, located on the first floor of The Furniture & Arts Building, London,
