The Culford Lantern

We have recently manufactured and installed one of our popular Culford Lanterns for a private client.

The lantern is an exact replica of an original lantern(circa 1800) that hung in the staircase of Culford School (located in the originally known Culford Hall), Bury St Edmunds. The design of the mansion during the Georgian period was attributed to James Wyatt.

Gothic and neoclassical elements that the popular but sometimes controversial, architect was known for can be seen in the metal castings on the lantern all of which are coloured to an antique lacquered brass finish.

12 lights fill the substantially sized lantern (Height 124cm Width 74cm), however they can contain more or less bulbs depending on your preference as each one is made to order at our workshops in Kent.

Interesting Fact

Did you know that Baccarat got its name from the village on the banks of the Meurthe River in France, it was initially named the Sainte-Anne glassworks when it was established in 1764.
